- Dillon Consulting is confident that we won't end up needing the Turbidity Meter for \$40,000.00

  - The portal is set to launch publicly in February 2026
- GUDI Report – Further assessment required for Well #5

*Fire*

- There have been no new updates on the status of the Fire Truck except continuing to wait for the chassis
- There were 5 fire calls in January and only 2 calls since our last meeting
- The lights in the fire hall have been replaced
